



Overall Objective

To enable LMICs around the world to implement genome and exome sequencing in children with rare undiagnosed genetic disorders.

By establishing a network of clinics in hospitals in LMICs.



Specific Objectives

- 1. To train local clinicians in genomic medicine in the genetic evaluation, result interpretation, and pre and post-test counselling;
- 2. To implement a research pilot program in which exome sequencing is performed in eligible patients for molecular diagnosis; and
- 3. To evaluate clinical outcomes, provider and patient satisfaction, ethical, social and legal implications, and cost-effectiveness of the intervention.

Next Steps

- Expression of interest from LMIC teams [36 prior to meeting + 2 now]
- Selection of local PIs and Teams at Implementation Sites
- Establishment of a Project PI & Steering Committee
- Development of a high-level Project Proposal
- Discussion with a funding agency followed by funding application
- LMIC government engagement
- Development of a detailed project proposal
- Obtain IRB approval from a Central IRB and Local IRBs
- Train project Implementation Teams
- Upgrade facilities in the clinics
- Project Implementation with monitoring and evaluation by the steering committee
